



PATROL RESPONSE TO ACTIVE SHOOTER KILLER

The PRASK system is the most advanced active shooter system for the patrol officer today. PRASK will utilize advanced concepts of building entry, movements and room clearing. PRASK is the most flexible and adaptive system compared to many of the outdated techniques still being taught today. Students will be instructed on the concept of the single officer first responder, as well as multiple officers and teams in handling an active shooter scenario. This course was created to answer the need for a more effective and efficient tactic for dealing with the active shooter. This course is a must for all patrol officers, supervisors, detectives, school resource officers and tactical team members.

Advanced tactics on building entry, movement and room clearing will be taught and cumulate into advanced force on force scenarios. Students will be instructed in advanced single officer response, team tactics, leadership, weapons handling, breaching, equipment considerations, empty hand - unarmed arrest and control techniques and rescue formations. This is a dynamic and fast paced course. Students will be expected to “think on their feet” and “out of the box” as they will be placed in leadership positions for all scenarios.

COURSE EQUIPMENT:

- Duty gear, belt and body armor
- Red/blue guns: handgun, rifle and/or shotgun is possible
- Uniform or fatigue style pants
- Uniform boots or shoes
- SIMS guns, ammunition, protective gear
- Course Hours: 16-24

TERMINAL PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES

At the end of the course it students will understand the difference between traditional barricaded gunmen tactics and the immediate action rapid deployment. Students will learn advanced room clearing tactics, building clearing and hostage rescue tactics. Team Movement inside and outside of buildings, team communications, rescue techniques, advanced principals for hostage rescue and room entry.

Students will further learn the background of the tactics, as well as the ever changing tactics.

ENABLING PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES

The class will begin with PowerPoint presentations, lecture and class room discussion. The class will then move out to an area to practice these skills in a fluid environment. The further the training progresses the more scenarios will become difficult presenting different problematic situations to be dealt with.
